NOTICE OF CHANGED FORMAT OF MEETING OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AUDIT & BUDGET AND TRANSIT BOARD MEETING SCHEDULED FOR AUGUST 12, 2020 DUE TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC

August 6, 2020

Illinois Governor JB Pritzker issued a <u>Disaster Proclamation</u> on July 24, 2020, which is in effect through August 24, 2020 to address this emergency. Section 12 of the Proclamation declares that in-person attendance of more than 50 people is not feasible in light of public health concerns. This means that Chicago Transit Authority public meetings occurring on August 12, 2020 will take place **only virtually.**

Illinois Governor JB Pritzker's Executive Order 2020-07, as extended by his Executive Order 2020-37, as well as Illinois Attorney General Guidance to Public Bodies on the Open Meetings Act and the Freedom of Information Act during the COVID-19 Pandemic allow for public bodies to hold public meetings electronically to prevent the transmission of COVID-19.
